Much of our attention these days remains focused on COVID-19. In light of the increased discussion on this and other illnesses, it is a good time to reflect on what the Church offers to those who are seriously ill and dying. For those who are sick and dying, the Church offers Anointing of the Sick. It is sometimes called Last Rites when given to the dying and in the past was also called Extreme Unction.

The sacrament has its basis in scripture. The letter of James states, "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven." (James 5:14-25). The Gospel of Mark also describes the twelve Apostles being sent out on mission by Jesus. Mark tells us that while on mission they "drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them" (Mark 6:13).

In the Anointing of the Sick, the priest anoints the sick person with the Oil of the Sick. As the priest anoints the person's forehead and palms he says, "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." and "May the Lord Who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."

When Anointing of the Sick is given to someone who is dying, it is commonly referred to as Last Rites. Along with this sacrament, it is ideal for a dying person to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Eucharist as Viaticum, that is, re-


ceiving Communion for the last time. One who is dying can also receive the Apostolic Pardon. This is a plenary indulgence that a priest can give to someone who is close to dying that releases them from all time in Purgatory. Finally, when someone is dying, the sacrament in accompanied by a set of prayers called Commendation of the Dying.

Lastly, I wanted to offer some advice concerning this Sacrament. First, don't wait too long to ask for it. When one begins to be in danger of death due to sickness or old age, the time to receive Anointing of the Sick has arrived. This would include undergoing serious operations as well as undergoing treatment for serious illnesses. Also, one does not have to be at the point of death to receive Last Rites. It would be best to call a priest as soon as it becomes clear that death is approaching. That allows Fr. Steve and I plenty of time to make sure the dying person receives the sacraments. Finally, don't assume that your family will know to request Last Rites for you. Make sure there's somebody among your family or friends who will make sure that a priest is called to administer these last sacraments should you be in a situation in which you can't ask for it yourself.

The Lord is generous with His grace surrounding these sacraments. I myself have seen them work powerfully in the lives of those who receive them. I've experienced the peace that comes over someone preparing for a major operation. I've seen people at the point of death go from a state of extreme agitation to deep peace from being anointed. They remind us that even some of the darkest moments of our lives are not beyond God's grace.




