






TREASURES TRIP TO NOLA ENJOYS AMAZING DIGITAL VAN GOGH EXHIBIT

What an amazing summer!

This year Edge ministry came back with serious energy - a packed schedule of trips, activities, and retreats for our middle school youth.

It is still truly amazing to watch the growth process for our young students as the summer goes by. Many rising 6th graders went on their first Edge trip ever to Waterville, feeling nervous about the experience, wondering how they would be treated by the older kids. That trip is usually a good test to see how well our Edge upperclassmen have heard and understood the principles of respect and kindness that we do our best to teach. Although students were from different grades and different schools, you wouldn't know it, after Waterville. From that point on the unity only grew, with at-

tendance numbers increasing for the rest of the Wednesday trips until the end of the summer.

Our open gym nights were slower to grow in popularity than the Wednesday trips, but they also had great attendance by the end of July. I am looking forward to seeing these community nights grow even more next year!

Each year, without fail, some question why we spend money on youth group trips to water parks when we could be spending it on church-related activities. My answer is that a trip to a water park IS a church-related activity! For many of our young participants, these trips are the only Christ-centered gatherings they experience during the summer. And participation comes with clear expectations: we begin and end with prayer, treat one another with respect, refrain from inappropriate speech and actions, etc. We are, in part, building the future of the Church in Baldwin County.

I humbly ask that you continue to keep our Edge students, their families and myself in your prayers. If you can give, please give! If you can volunteer, please volunteer! Thank you for all that you do for middle school youth ministry here at St. Lawrence.

After a year of fundraising, Life Teen finally made our way to Covecrest at the end of July! So many wonderful supporters helped us make it happen. This retreat has enriched the lives of every teen who attended, as well as our youth group as a whole.

Covecrest was a beautiful experience, and well worth the time it took to get us there. Nestled in the Blue Ridge mountains of Georgia, thirty-one teens arrived ready to receive whatever God had prepared for them.

Life Teen spent the school year focused on exploring the question 'Who am I to you, God?' which set us up perfectly ready to spend six days drenched in intimate time with Jesus through prayer and reflection, balanced with community time and activities. When we left camp at the end of the retreat, I asked each participant for their reflections on the week. My heart was humbled to accompany these teenagers and witness their beautiful encounters with God. I watched them grow even more, to know and love Him as a friend. Another fruit of this retreat is the way it helped to bond the youth group together. Community is so important for everyone, and it's particularly imperative for teens to have support from their peers as they're growing in their faith. I was able to witness the teens praying for one another, encouraging one another, and sharing with each other the ways God has worked in their lives.




OUR PRAYERS ARE WITH YOU, PHILLIP SYLVESTER



On August 1, 2022, I will begin my first year in discernment of my vocation to the priesthood with the Marians of the Immaculate Conception (MIC) in Stockbridge, Massachusetts.
