

PARTICIPANTS RECEIVE SPIRITUAL ENRICHMENT THROUGH RETREAT AT SACRED HEART

m T}$ he annual QUEST retreat at Sacred Heart chapel was a huge success this year! Students began arriving bright and early on the morning of March 13th, and although the day began with some fog, it turned into a perfectly sunny spring day. Most of the retreat took place outside on the grass, so we could not have asked for better weather.

A large number of students attended this year from both Christ the King and St. Lawrence's Edge programs - 73 in total, ranging from 6th to 8th grade. Upon arrival, they were sorted into small groups of ten and spent the day playing games, listening to talks, and praying as a group. This gave the students the opportunity to get to know other Catholic youth living in Baldwin County and maybe make some new friends! We have several examples in both of our youth ministry programs at St. Lawrence of lifelong friendships that began with a small group on a retreat. We always get excited to see how the Lord works through these new relationships.

The model for QUEST was developed several years ago specifically for middle school youth, and is designed around an acronym that represents a spiritual journey for a young person: Questioning, Understanding, Evangelization, Service, and Trust. Young Catholic adults who are knowledgable and devout were selected to give a talk inside Sacred Heart, and this year the talks were especially well-received. We hope that the seeds of a lifelong faith were planted in the hearts of the students who listened!

As always, the retreat included Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and a special vigil Mass for the students and their families. These are the two most important parts of connecting the content of a retreat with the goal that we all have in mind as Catholics, which is to be holy. Many of the students had never been to Adoration with worship music before, and likewise many of them had never been to Mass on the bay, but everyone who attended seemed to have a positive experience.

Thank you to everyone who helped make this retreat possible. We are very excited to find out what QUEST will be like next year!


2021 RITE OF ELECTION AND CALL TO CONTINUING CONVERSION


