






LENTEN BOOK REVIEWS FOR YOU





The subtitle of this book is "A Practical Guide To Prayer For Active People," and while it meets that objective, it has a lot more to offer than one might surmise from its size, a brief 167 pages. Only one of the five pillars deal directly with verbal prayer. The other pillars are the Eucharist, the Beatitudes, the Holy Spirit, and the contemplative life (the latter being the largest section of the book, summarizing Ignatian-type spiritual practices). Unlike many books that have only a few key points expanded with a lot of filler, Fr. Spitzer writes in a very concise, comprehensive style, packing a lot of information into every section. (Even his Table of Contents is in outline form with subsections and sub-subsections!). Those familiar with Fr. Spitzer's other works may see some information repeated here (specifically in regards to the four levels of desire and happiness), but Fr. Spitzer puts a fresh spin on it by showing how they tie into the spiritual exercises he proposes. (He also includes an epilogue with more depth on this topic, so the reader does not have to refer to those earlier works.) Bottom line: While I found this book to be an enjoyable fast read. there is a lot to unpack, and I am already making plans to re-read certain sections. Recommended. -J. This year, though, it seemed in keeping with the times that we stayed close to home, led by our local priests, and focused on the foundation of our faith, the Eucharist.

Mass was celebrated for three consecutive evenings, with the mission presentation delivered as the homily. The presenting priests, Fr. Napolitano, Fr. Morrison, and our own Fr. Steve, referred to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, which states that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. Each priest, in his own style, reminded us of Who we receive in Communion, Jesus Himself. We were challenged to gaze in appreciation and adoration as

the priest raises the Host at the consecration. We were also reminded that the Eucharist is our starting point, and we were not simply dismissed at the end of Mass, but that we were sent to take the Lord beyond the church doors into our families and communities. At the end of our lives, we will return to Jesus and be with Him forever.

What better way to cap off a Eucharistic-themed Lenten mission than with a Eucharistic procession, each person carrying a lighted candle. All the lit candles moving in procession were so very beautiful. Surely that scene made a visual impact on all those driving down the street, too. The Mass and procession were followed by a delicious spaghetti meal shared with our parish family. Great food, spiritual and physical, with great company—life doesn't get any better!




