

Our Christmas schedule is listed on the back page. Sending my prayers for a holy and merry Christmas for you all.









THE FAITH OF OUR YOUNG **CATHOLICS IN 2023**

This Fall, an overnight retreat was offered to sophomores preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation. The retreat provided participants with an opportunity to learn and grow in their faith. There is something special about Adoration, praise and worship in the evening when there are less distractions.

Jake Kosokcka, a junior at Auburn University, presented an amazing talk on the Eucharist. It's good for high school sophomore students to hear from college students who are just a few years ahead of them in life and in their faith. Later that night, students had an opportunity to sit around the fire and talk with Dillon about their faith and the struggles they encounter as teenagers.



HOW DOES ONE GROW IN FAITH & UNDERSTANDING?

This process is gradual and happens over time. One thing that is really helpful is when young people see a good example and receive quality formation from someone close to them in age.

OUR YOUNG PEOPLE AND THEIR FAITH

At one point during the weekend, the students were presented with a few questions. The responses to these questions shed light on the state of these students and their peers. This information helps inform the way we minister to them and the way you, parents and parishioners, can assist our young people in their journey. According to our young people, almost all report that their families go to Mass every Sunday. Most report that they are actively involved in their youth group and almost all report their youth group supports their faith. This reveals the importance of formation in the home, as well as youth group programs, to support and assist our young people in their growth and maturity in the faith.

THE IMPORTANCE OF FRIENDSHIPS

All the students reported that their friends support their faith and most said their friends help them make good decisions. Peer pressure can also be a huge factor in making good decisions. It is important that we educate, promote and support our young people so they understand the value of good, healthy and positive friendships.

The students of the Pro-life club at St. Michael's High School, led by sponsors Drew Williams & Gabrielle Smith, also attended. 
